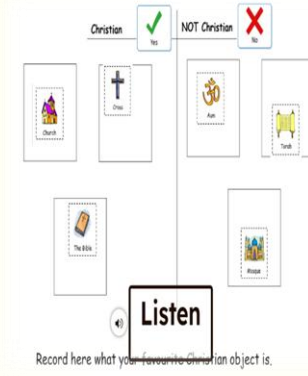
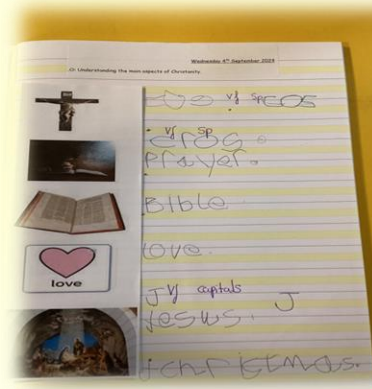
# Year 1 Faith Week BRITISH VALUES

Year 1 explored different objects and artefacts from Christianity. We sorted Christian and non-Christian objects using our knowledge.

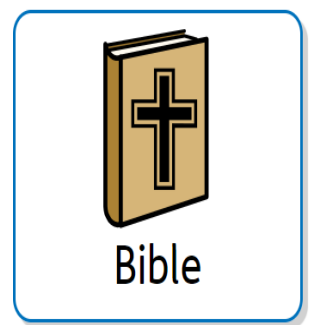
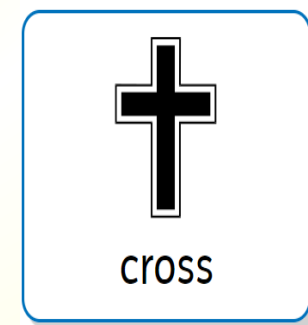
We have been learning about a faith different to our own as part of Faith and Culture Week. This links to our British values of tolerance and respect for other faiths.



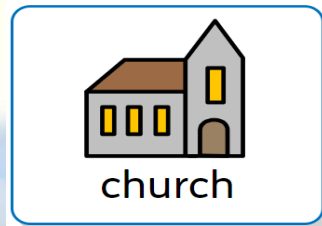

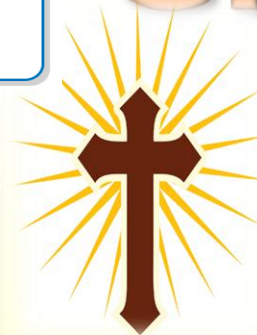
The children began with learning about the key beliefs of Christianity. We discussed how the cross, the Bible and showing love are important to Christians and wrote about them.

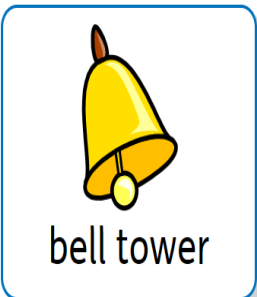
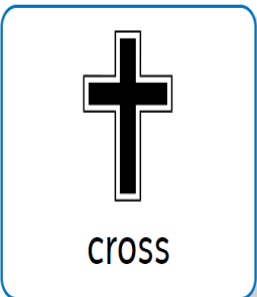
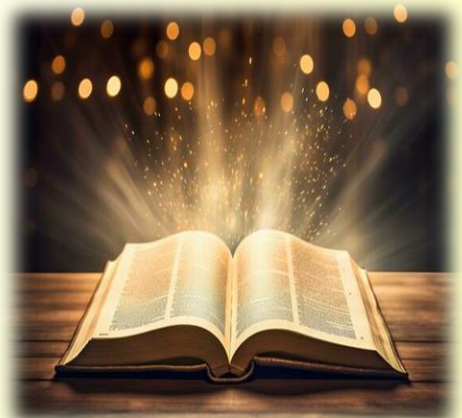


We looked at famous cathedrals in the Church of England such as St Paul's in London and had a virtual walking tour of St Philip's in Birmingham.

# Year 2 - Hinduism



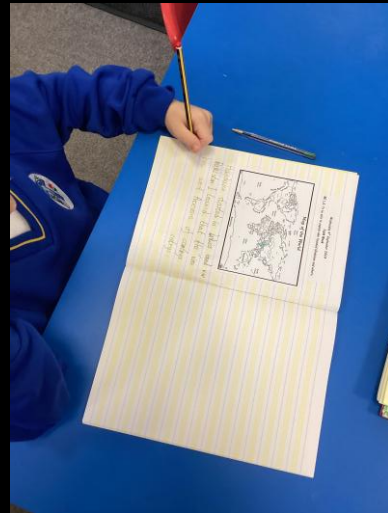
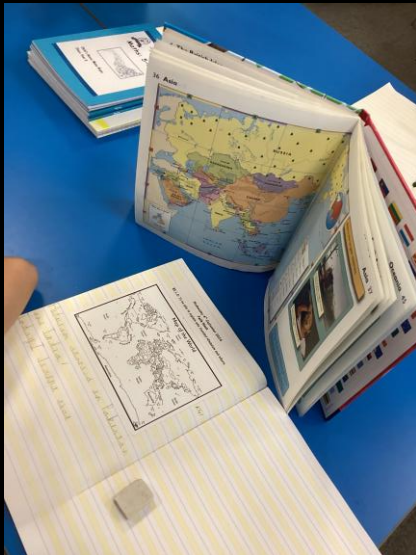
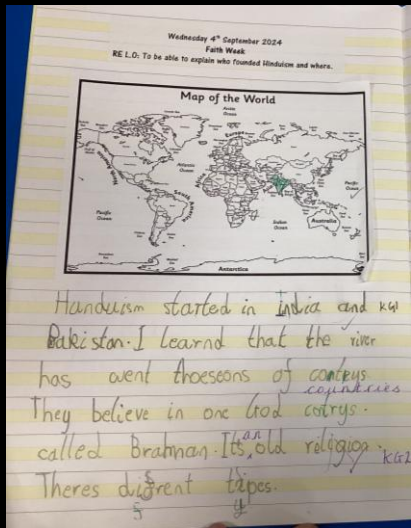
This week, we have learned about the Hindu faith.

This week, we have learned about the Hindu faith.

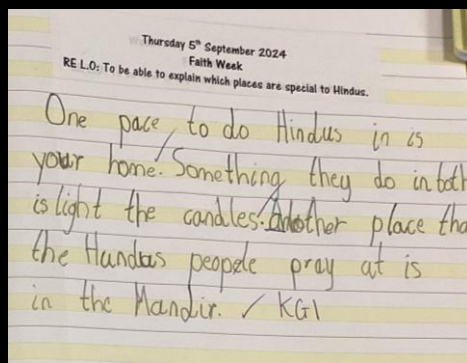
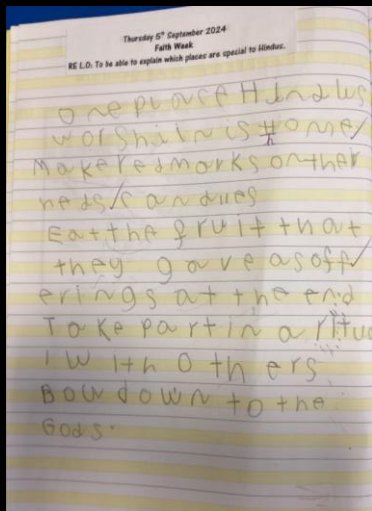


Not only do Hindus pray in the Mandir but they also do this at home, together with their families. We watched a video of someone showing us how and what they do.

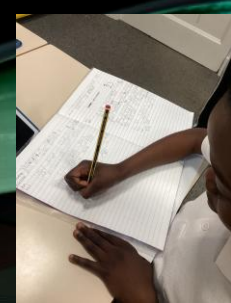
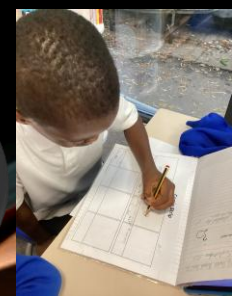

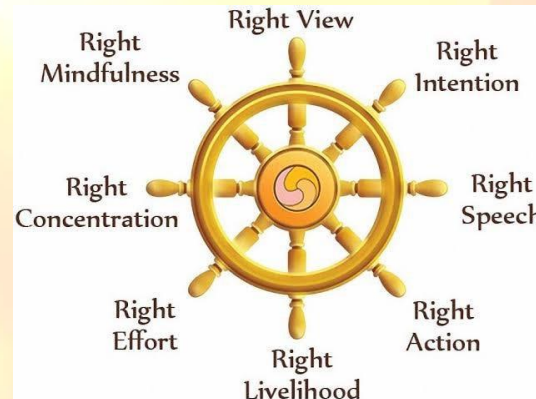
# Year 4 Faith Week - Buddhism
