CATHOLIC VIRTUES FOR SUMMER 2

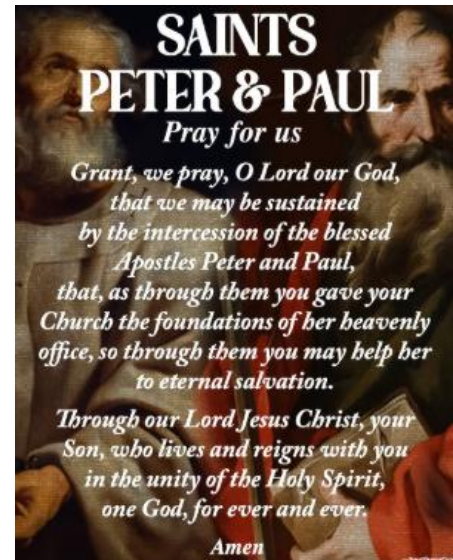
The Catholic Virtues for Summer 2 are **Faith-filled** and **Hopeful**.
